SAN JOSE CLEAN ENERGY & ELECTRIC VEHICLES

San José Clean Energy (SJCE) is a new electricity generation provider operated by the City of San José that powers homes and businesses with cleaner energy at lower rates than PG&E.

More than 60% of San José's greenhouse gas emissions come from transportation. SJCE is committed to expanding electric vehicle (EV) adoption to help reduce air pollution and preserve our planet for future generations.

ELECTRICITY RATES

EV drivers can get special time-of-use (TOU) electricity rates that incentivize charging during off-peak hours, like at night when you are sleeping, until 3:00 p.m.


SJCE offers the same EV rate options as PG&E, but with 1% lower rates and more renewable energy.

Customers enroll for an EV rate through PG&E, and PG&E transmits that information to SJCE.

NEW EV RATES

As of July 1, 2019, PG&E and SJCE discontinued EV-A and opened EV-2.

- In November 2019, all EV-A customers will be moved to EV-2, except solar net energy metering customers eligible for grandfathered treatment who can refuse transition to EV-2.
- EV-2 peak hours are from 4:00-9:00 p.m. every day, with higher rates in the summer than winter.



Note: TOU periods are year-round.

- A fun ride! EVs generally have faster acceleration and lower noise.


REBATES AND INCENTIVES

With so many rebates and incentives, buying a new or used EV is often cheaper than a gas car. Max incentive amounts listed:

- Federal Tax Credit: \$7,500 on a new EV
- Clean Vehicle Rebate Project: \$2,500 on a new EV, includes leases
- Clean Fuel Rebate: \$800 on a new or used EV, includes leases

Additional incentives for low-income households:

 Clean Vehicle Assistance Program: \$5,000 on a new or used EV



 Clean Cars for All: \$9,500 on a new or used EV, includes leases, plus \$2,000 towards Level 2 charger equipment and installation
